25.11.1 The Chair welcomed all to the meeting.

25.11.2 Present and Apologies

25.11.3 Declarations of Pecuniary or Personal Interest – None

- **25.11.4 Minutes of Last Meeting** Members confirmed and accepted the minutes of the previous meeting on 9 September 2025 as a correct record, with one small correction to the domain name in item 25.9.28.
- **25.11.5 Public Session** Frodesley resident Mr C Knowles raised the issue of flooding on the Frodesley-Longnor Road. This is a problem which is becoming increasing frequent and severe. At worst times residents become marooned and access to Longnor School is cut off. There are three key places where the road floods particularly badly near:
 - Haypole Farm gullies blocked, ditch overgrown
 - Longnor Crossroads blocked drains, ditch is on field side and is obscured by debris built into mound on verge preventing water egress
 - Upper Farm no drains, gullies blocked

Even when drains are cleared all the pipes between them are completed blocked and need jetting. The Council is keen for there to be some resolution to these issues and asked Cllr Naylor to continue to engage Shropshire Council (SC) on this. Cllr Naylor also wishes to investigate whether any local farmers can do anything to alleviate issues. Action: Cllr Naylor to invite Tom Dainty, SC cabinet member for flooding for a site visit, Cllr G Davies to attend on behalf of Council.

Councillors also noted their ongoing and increasing concern about the problems with the drains in both Acton Burnell and Pitchford. Whilst the grids are washed out infrequently, the pipework between the grids is not cleared. This results in regular flooding of the gardens and drives of properties adjacent to the roads.

Action: Clerk to write to SC, with a copy to Cllr Naylor, requesting that, as a matter of urgency, the pipework between the grids is rodded and jetted to allow rainwater to once again flow through them thereby avoiding flooding in domestic properties.

 - Cllr Naylor chased outstanding work on 30mph limit in Frodesley and associated work
 and received response from SC Highways that it is still in programme and should be
 advertised within the next month subject to approval by SC Spending Control Board.
 The Council pointed out that it had received a similar response several months ago with
 no progress. Action: Cllr Naylor to escalate to Highways Cabinet Member

 longer able to drive. Cllr Long mentioned mental health and isolation in farming
 community. Action: Clerk to add discussion of volunteer drivers to aid isolated people
 to agenda for next meeting
